

David Allen Price died November 15, 2006 in Kinder, Louisiana. He was born December 17, 1922 to David Allen and Olive Carson Price in Huntingdon, PA.

After graduating from Huntington High School in 1941, he married his lifelong sweetheart, Alma Arlene "Bunny" Hearn in Huntingdon, PA on April 11, 1942.

A World War II Army veteran awarded for Meritorious Service, he served with the 43rd Signal Company as a radio operator and mechanic in the Southern Philippines. Meritorious awards include the Philippines Liberation Ribbon, 3 Bronze Stars, and the WW II Victory Medal.

Trusting God, caring for his family, helping people and fixing anything that broke, he and his "Bunny" moved their home to 7 states where he worked in multi-craft maintenance. Antique automobiles which he restored are on display at the Swigart Museum in Huntingdon, PA.

He is survived by his wife, Alma Arlene Hearn Price of LA; three sons, Donald David Price of AR, James Winston Price of AK, and Patrick William Price of KY; one daughter, Vicki Price Reeves of LA, 11 grandchildren, 21 great-grandchildren, one great-great grandson and one brother, Edward Price of Ohio.
