

Jellyfish

Included: Mod Podge, tissue paper, paintbrush, string

What you will need: small bowl, cling wrap, non-stick baking paper

Step 1: Place non-stick baking paper on your work surface- this prevents your jellyfish from sticking to your surface.

Step 2: Place your bowl, face down, on the baking paper. Wrap the bowl in cling wrap and tuck the ends under the bowl.

Step 3: Take a piece of tissue paper and place over the bowl with cling wrap and tuck the ends under the bowl.

Step 4: Paint the tissue paper all over with Mod Podge, then lay a second sheet on top but this time don't tuck the ends under the bowl. Leave the ends spread out around the bowl. Paint the tissue paper that's covering the bowl with Mod Podge (no Mod Podge on the edges that are spread out).

Step 5: Lay a 3rd piece of tissue paper over this and press down gently. Leave overnight to dry- do not skip this step, I know it's hard to wait!

Step 6: Once dry, add a final protective coat of Mod Podge and let it dry again (ugh, I know!).

Step 7: Remove the bowl and cling wrap.

Step 8: Trim around the edge, leaving a "ruffle" of tissue paper around the edges.

Step 9: Poke 2 holes in the top using a toothpick or something pointy. Thread the string through and tie a knot to create a loop to hang your jellyfish.

Step 10: Make some stingers by fringing a long piece of folded tissue paper. Use tape or Mod Podge to stick to the inside of your jellyfish.
